1/4/23 Minutes: *"Director Zamft; he seemed open and supportive of this committee and adds a vision that this committee hasn't seen from the administration prior to now. He did say that Public Works hasn't fully bought into "Green Streets" but they are using the checklist. The policy may need updating"*
- **Note:** Resolution No. 37-2018, AKA the Complete and Green Streets Policy, is still in effect, and it is an important qualification for participating in federal infrastructure grant programs for complete streets projects.
