Howard - We need to figure out the exact role of this committee. Ideas would be presented by administration and we'd read about it in the newspaper. We have expertise and can advise, but we need to know about projects before they happen.

Gayle explains difference in maintenance (checklist) vs capital projects (project scoping) and where TAC involvement would be.

  3. Requesting crosswalk from lower lake to nature center across north woodland. Trying to link parklands.,
  4. Already a curb cut on west side, need to add curb ramp on east side.
  5. Distance for crossing in crosswalk uphill and pretty far distance.

**Dan - can this be done as part of the sewer district work ? flashing yellow?**

**John - that's in other parts of the park**

**Gayle - yes, flashing yellow is appropriate here to alert vehicles.**

**Howard - if we go forward with it and shaker doesn't, does that matter?**

### **3. Safe Streets Update**

1. Presented by Chris Brace
  - Vision zero update for q4 2024
    1. Crash data from ostats
    2. 1 fatal crash, 231 total crashes
    3. Noble and warransville fatal
    4. 5 serious injury
    5. Theme is that all crashes happened in known part of high crash area, all due to known design flaw, all preventable
    6. Dan- doesn't tell us what's going on in the car with the driver
    7. Chris - we don't know that, but we know how the road is built
    8. Why are people crashing in certain locations more often than others.
    9. Comprehensive costs - national safety council comprehensive costs. Financial costs of an accident plus human factor cost (life, mobility, earned income, etc).
    10. 231 crash total cost \$40mil+
    11. Cleveland heights has been \$100mil+ every year for the last decade
    12. Dan - does cleveland heights get more traffic that makes it have more crashes than others?
    13. Chris - yes, our numbers aren't the worst, but not the best.

14. Howard - downtown and university circle main employment centers that get a lot traffic
15. Gayle - we have historic wide roads because of street cars and some narrow roads we can't widen
16. Chris - road diets 4/3+1 are programmed, traffic calming, realigning intersections,

#### 4. 2025 Street Resurfacing Plan - Committee Review

1. Discussion of document and vote for adoption - see attached report
  - Euclid Heights - Coventry to Cedar Glen
    1. All study plans have called for bicycle improvements, separated bike lanes, and high vis crosswalks
    2. Gayle - Where would multi-purpose trail or cylotrack go?
    3. Chris - no, exact location/design of bike lanes design
    4. Howard - is euclid heights going to be completely replaced or resurfaced?
    5. Dan - probably just 2"? If you start to include in right of way, that has a lot of impacts.
  - North park: mlk to arlington
    1. Sidewalks entire length
    2. Protected bike lanes - painted and flexiposts whole length
    3. Gail - was this in CESAP
    4. Chris - yes, based on bicycle level of comfort
    5. Howard - add arlington crosswalk as footnote

Gayle - motion to approve report on 2025 resurfacing projects prepared by Chris including note modification about crosswalk at arlington and north woodland, request City Administrator to present the report to Planning and Public Works departments, and we request a written and oral response to the recommendations at the February TaMC meeting.
