City Services

Cleveland Heights City Hall is closed to the public until further notice but the work of local government continues with some changes. Below are ways to contact various departments and staff during this time.

Emergency services/first responders are fully operational and continue to look out for the safety of all residents. Public works also continues uninterrupted.

POLICE DEPARTMENT

Copies of Police Reports

Parking Ticket Payments

Payments for parking tickets can be mailed to 40 Severance Circle, Cleveland Heights, Ohio 44118 or placed in the drop box located on City Hall's circular drive. Filing a Police Report/Report a Crime

Minor incidents or crimes can be reported online, through the Report A Crime page online (www.clevelandheights.com/1279/Report-A-Crime). The online form can be downloaded to the computer. Once completed, the form should be emailed to oic@clvhts.com. The report will be reviewed by a supervisor and assigned an incident number, which will be provided to the person filing the report. If additional follow-up is needed, an officer will contact the person directly either by email or phone. As always, please call 216-291-1234 if a problem or incident is currently occurring; if it's an emergency call 911. Citizens with questions as to whether their concerns can be resolved without having to come to the Police Department or have an officer come to their home, are encouraged to contact the Police Department directly at 216-291-4619 or email myp@clvhts.com.



FIRE DEPARTMENT

Fire and EMS calls are not disrupted during this time. Business and home inspection, which are handled by Fire Prevention, are temporarily suspended during the pandemic. To schedule future inspections, call 216-291-2973 or email jstreb@clvhts.com. The distribution of smoke detectors is also temporarily suspended. PUBLIC WORKS

Bulk items will be picked up once per month during the first FULL week of each month on the resident's regular trash day. Bulk is limited to four items per pickup and any fabric item must be wrapped in plastic. If there are more than four items or the bulk pickup needs to occur on a day that is different than the regularly scheduled day, please call 216-691-7300 to schedule a special pickup; there is an additional fee. HOUSING DEPARTMENT

All interior inspections on occupied properties have been temporarily suspended. Exterior inspections will continue but be limited to Point of Sales and complaints. New Point of Sale inspections on vacant properties will receive an exterior inspection with the interior to be subject to inspection at a later date. The City will also review any private inspection report conducted in order to complete the interior inspection on a Point of Sale. Anyone requesting an inspection must download the forms from the City's Forms Page at www.clevelandheights.com/849/Forms. Call 216-291-5900 with any specific questions.

BUILDING DEPARTMENT

Anyone requesting a permit must download the forms from www.clevelandheights.com/849/Forms and send the form either by using the City Hall drop box located in the circular drive or by mail with payment. Once the permit is issued and the work is completed, staff will coordinate a FaceTime or Skype session in order to close out/finalize the permit.

All new construction interiors that are unoccupied will be inspected as usual. Occupied construction will only close out interior permit work with a FaceTime or Skype session. The Ascent at Top of the Hill Begins to Take Shape



With the start of construction this spring, the highly anticipated and catalytic mixed-use development, known as the Ascent at Top of the Hill, is gaining momentum and beginning to take shape.

The focus of initial construction activities has been on foundation and utilities installation for both the parking garage and Building #1 located at "the Point" (the intersection of Euclid Heights Boulevard and Cedar Road). The garage foundation is complete and structured decks and columns are currently being installed.

Snow Plow Season



The Cleveland Heights Service Department is armed and ready for this year's winter snow plowing season. During heavy snowfall events, plow trucks are diverted onto the main streets first. Once main streets are safe and passable, trucks then proceed to plow secondary side streets. In order to ensure a safe and successful season clearing the City's roadways, the department asks that residents and motorists observe the following guidelines:

- Do not attempt to pass plow trucks.
- Do not follow closer than 25 feet from the rear of a plow truck.
- Use caution and slow your speed when driving on freshly fallen snow and/or snow that has not been plowed.
- Please do not throw snow from driveways and sidewalks into the street.

Building #2, which is to include residential and commercial uses interior to the project and apartments along Euclid Heights Boulevard, should be well underway throughout 2021. Construction of the Top of the Hill is to be performed over one continuous phase spanning 18 to 24 months. At this point, all major elements of construction are either on or ahead of schedule.

The parking garage is anticipated to be completed and open for parking sometime after the 2nd Quarter of 2021. The entire development is to be completed in Spring of 2022 and open shortly thereafter.

Holiday Collection Schedule

Refuse collection will be delayed by one day for Monday through Friday routes as listed below. Friday's collection will be on Saturday. Additionally, City Hall offices are closed on these dates. As a reminder, bulk collection occurs once per month during the first full week of the month. During this time, bulk will be collected on your trash day the week of December 7 and the week of January 4, 2021. Bulk is limited to 4 items.

- Veterans' Day, Wednesday, November 11
- Thanksgiving Day, Thursday, November 26
- Christmas Day, Friday, December 25
- New Year's Day, Friday, January 1, 2021
- Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Day, Monday, January 21, 2021
- Presidents Day, Monday, February 15, 2021

Reminder

Yard waste will not be collected from November to April 30 due to the restructuring of manpower to snow and ice control. A special loose leaf collection of leaves and brush will take place November 2-30. Do not place leaves in yard waste bags during this time. Rake leaves to the curb. Do not rake rocks or trash in with your leaves.


Technottrash

Safely recycle items that may contain personal information, old CDs, DVDs, diskettes, audio and videotapes, cell phones, pagers, PDAs, digital cameras, CPUs, monitors, keyboards, printers and rechargeable batteries (no televisions). Bring them to the top of the ramp at the Transfer Station, Monday-Friday, 7 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.; the driveway is on Mayfield Road next to Foundation Honda.

In cases where there is an elderly or disabled resident, they can call 216-691-7300 for a technottrash pickup from their home weighing no heavier than 40 pounds on their trash day.

Christmas Tree Disposal

Live Christmas trees will be collected Monday, December 28-Friday, January 29 from tree lawns. Please remove any bags, stands, and decorations as the trees are collected and processed through a wood chipper. Residents are advised that collection of trees is not routine to their collection day as the Forestry Department has limited manpower resources.
